Message from the CEO



Every day at Rawlins County Health Center, our dedicated providers, staff and leadership work hard to not only deliver high-quality care, but also to continuously enhance our services.

To that end, in 2023 we welcomed several new physicians—Dr. Charles Frankum, general surgeon; Thomas Eddy, DPM, podiatrist and foot and ankle surgeon; and Dr. Chance Williams, family medicine physician. In addition, three specialist consultants are now available for virtual appointments in nephrology, rheumatology and endocrinology. And Kayla Ketzner, RN, joined our team as Nurse Case Manager. She helps coordinate care for patients with complex needs.

We also upgraded essential equipment, including our Omnicell medication distribution system, which is critical to ensuring that the right patient gets the right medication at the right time and that potentially dangerous prescription drugs such as narcotics are locked and monitored. Other equipment purchases included new defibrillators, a new lab chemistry analyzer for routine blood testing and a new ER ultrasound machine.


With more than 6,200 clinic visits, 11,400 rehabilitation sessions and 700 ER visits in addition to essential hospital care in 2023, RCHC is your community healthcare center. On behalf of the RCHC board of directors and team, thank you for your continued trust and patronage.

New Equipment Purchased in 2023

Omnicell: Medication distribution system to improve patient safety, located in the pharmacy, for inpatient/outpatients and in the emergency/trauma department for emergency room patients.

Lab Chemistry Analyzer: Update to previous equipment.

Zoll Defibrillator: Life-saving cardiac event equipment, one for emergency/trauma department and one for inpatient floor. This purchase was made possible by a local donor.

Ultrasound Machine: To improve speed of bladder scans in trauma situations.

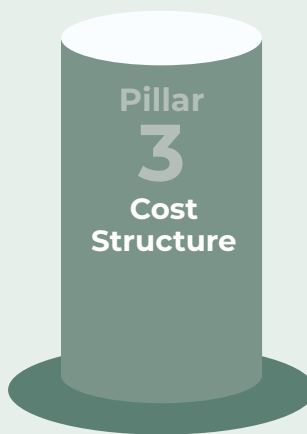
Rawlins County Health Center Strategic Plan



RCHC helps to meet the community's healthcare needs by providing patient-centered facilities and advanced medical equipment. New services are developed based on community needs and RCHC's capabilities.



Instilling a patient and family-centered care culture across RCHC will create momentum for continued organizational improvement.



RCHC is taking a series of proactive measures to ensure we continue to have the financial resources to carry out our mission for years to come.



Through positive recognition and celebration, RCHC perpetuates and reinforces principles of open communication, teamwork and respect, while providing needed resources and tools for employee engagement and organizational development.



In 2023, **175 donors** gave over **\$169,458.97**. Donations include over **\$19,000** in proceeds from the annual RCHC Foundation Golf Tournament and **\$97,850** in grants from the Patterson Family Foundation.

\$113,075.06 of equipment was purchased by the Foundation and its donors. Spirometry system, Physical Therapy Treatment Tables (proceeds from golf tournament 2022), Omnicell (\$75,000 of total cost), and \$30,000 towards two defibrillators.
